Tuition and Fees

Tuition and fees are charged as indicated and are subject to change without notice. All tuition charges are per unit unless otherwise indicated. Tuition is payable by check, MasterCard, Visa, or American Express, and is due in full at the time of registration. Checks should be made payable to John F. Kennedy University. A \$30 fee is assessed for checks returned because of insufficient funds.

Tuition is refundable on a percentage basis according to the dates published by the registrar's office. Generally, fees—including course materials fees—are non-refundable. Students expecting to drop courses or to seek a refund of tuition or fees should consult with the appropriate offices beforehand.

Financial Aid

JFK University welcomes students of all income levels. A brochure describing the University's major financial aid programs and application procedures is available from the Financial Aid Office. Financial aid may not be available to students in certificate programs. It is not available to nondegree students. John F. Kennedy University is able to offer financial assistance only to US citizens, noncitizen nationals, permanent residents and students from specific US territories. Projected Graduation/Completion Rates for John F. Kennedy University

In 1991, the US Congress amended the Higher Education Act of 1965. This act requires colleges and universities disbursing financial aid to provide students and potential students with information about the graduation/completion rates of their undergraduate students enrolled in degree or certificate programs. The criteria for calculating graduation rates established by this act does not match the student profile at John F. Kennedy University. JFK University does not offer a four year baccalaureate degree. The typical undergraduate student at the University is a reentry student with a desire to complete a previously started degree here, or at another institution of higher education, and/or one who wishes to attend school on a part-time basis.
